LAKE ALMANOR-A nesting bald eagle was found shot to death Thursday, March 22, 2007 at Lake Almanor in Plumas County.

Bob Orange, a warden with the state Department of Fish and Game, said the dead eagle was found by a hiker at the base of an old-growth cedar tree that has served as a successful nesting site for at least the last six years.

Orange said the bird was a mature bald eagle that was probably 4 to 5 years old. The nesting tree is one of seven known bald eagle nesting sites at the lake, and breeding season is under way now.
